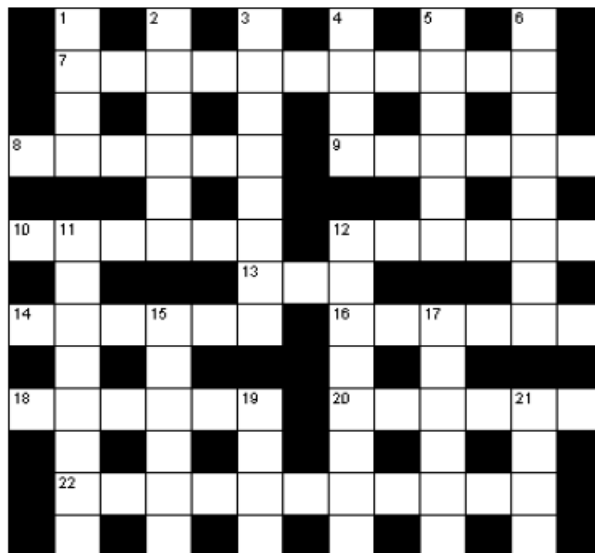

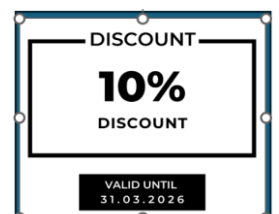

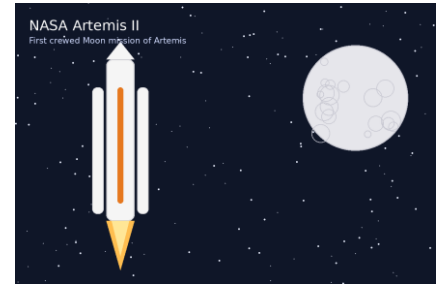

NASA's next Moon mission: Artemis II

A crewed flight around the Moon — testing the journey before the next steps

NASA is preparing for Artemis II, the first crewed flight of the Artemis program, using the Space Launch System (SLS) rocket and the Orion spacecraft. After lift-off from Florida, Orion will first orbit Earth, then head for the Moon. It will travel into deep space, swing around the far side of the Moon, and return to Earth on a trajectory designed for a safe homecoming. The mission's main purpose is to test the full end-to-end journey with astronauts onboard: life-support, communications, navigation, and the heat-shield and parachutes needed for a fast return to Earth.

Artemis II is a crucial dress rehearsal for later missions. NASA's current plan is for astronauts to attempt a return to the lunar surface with Artemis III in 2027.



Local update: Ferry Meadows parking changes (including parkrun)

Nene Park Trust is introducing updated parking arrangements at Ferry Meadows from 1 February 2026, alongside a new scheme aimed at making Saturday mornings smoother for parkrun participants.

Regular users may find an annual option good value: the Park offers an annual parking membership, and a dedicated parkrun parking membership is also available for Saturday mornings. Spread across the year, it works out at only a small weekly cost for frequent visitors.

Some people have raised concerns that charges could push parking onto nearby residential streets, and that volunteers might be put off. If you're affected, a practical approach is to car-share where possible, arrive a little earlier, or consider one of the annual options — while also being mindful of neighbours if you're parking outside the park. The aim is to reduce queues at the pay machines and keep the park welcoming for everyone — walkers, families, cyclists, volunteers and runners alike.

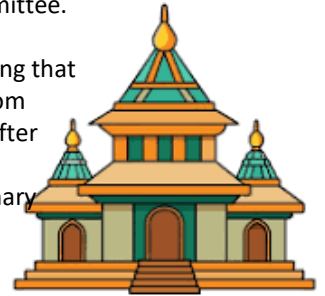


Council 'call-in' after outcry over proposed sale of building housing Peterborough Temple

Scrutiny councillors say decision-making and information provided need closer examination.

What's happening: the New England Complex decision is being reviewed by the council's scrutiny committee.

A decision by Peterborough City Council to dispose of the New England Complex — a community building that houses the Bharat Hindu Samaj temple — has been 'called in' for scrutiny, following strong concern from worshippers and local supporters. The council's Cabinet approved the disposal on 16 December 2025 after a competitive "best and final offer" (BAFO) process. Three councillors then submitted a formal call-in request, which the Monitoring Officer accepted as valid on 23 December 2025, triggering an extraordinary scrutiny meeting to examine the decision and next steps.



Temple trustees and community members say the site is more than a place of worship: they describe it as a community hub used for wellbeing support and activities, including a seniors' luncheon club. They also say they believed a purchase price had been agreed earlier in 2025, and were shocked when the process moved to a competitive bidding round.

At the scrutiny stage, the call-in grounds include allegations that the switch from a negotiated route to tender was not handled in line with the council's own decision-making principles, and that councillors did not have the full information needed when the sale route and preferred bidder were agreed.

The council says it has a statutory duty to secure best consideration when disposing of land and property, and that an independent valuation and audit trail were used in the BAFO process. The Cabinet decision identifies a preferred bidder as "Bidder B" (not publicly named).

Why people are upset: campaigners argue that a building with clear community benefit should have been considered through community-led options — such as Community Asset Transfer — before an open-market sale. The council's own CAT guidance describes asset transfer as a route for community organisations to manage and run council assets to support community services. What happens next: scrutiny councillors can allow the decision to proceed, refer it back to Cabinet for reconsideration with recommendations, or (in certain circumstances) refer it to full Council. For the community using the building, the outcome will determine whether the temple can remain in place and on what terms.

Jamie's Italian Hunter's Chicken Stew (Gluten Free)

The hearty Italian classic with a delicious red wine sauce

Prep: 30 mins Cook: 90 mins Skill: Easy Serves: 6

Ingredients

- 2 kg chicken, jointed, or equivalent chicken pieces
- Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 8 bay leaves
- 2 sprigs fresh rosemary
- 3 cloves garlic (1 crushed, 2 sliced)
- ½ bottle Chianti
- Gluten free flour (for dusting)
- Extra virgin olive oil
- 6 anchovy fillets
- 1 handful green or black olives (stoned)
- 2 x 400 g good-quality tinned plum tomatoes

**Method**

- 1) Season chicken with salt and pepper. Add bay leaves, rosemary and crushed garlic. Cover with Chianti and marinate at least 1 hour (overnight if possible).
- 2) Preheat oven to 180°C/350°F/gas 4. Drain chicken (keep marinade), pat dry, dust with gluten-free flour. Brown chicken in olive oil; set aside.
- 3) Fry sliced garlic gently, then add anchovies, olives and tomatoes. Return chicken and reserved marinade. Bring to the boil, cover and bake 1½ hours.
- 4) Skim excess oil, stir and season. Remove bay leaves/rosemary. Serve with salad or cannellini beans, and plenty of Italian red wine.

Note: Much better homemade than any pre-packed version.



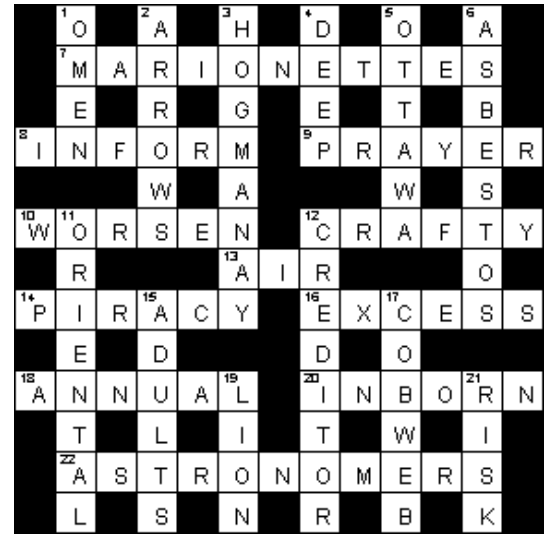
