This month's Oracle is packed with dates for the diary, local updates and a few practical ideas for making the most of the season (even if the weather can't quite decide what it's doing).

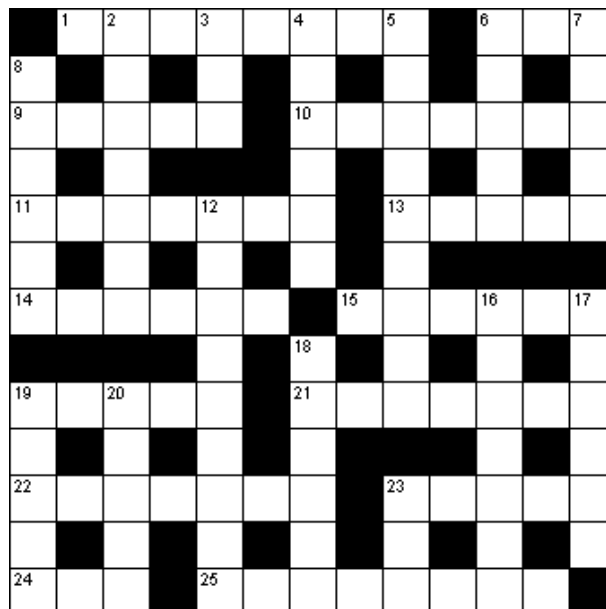
If you're new to the area, or you've been meaning to try something different, consider this your nudge: pop along to a group, bring a friend, or simply say hello to someone you recognise.

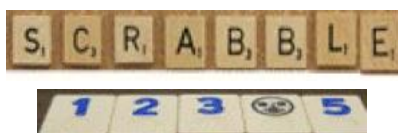

Spring skies: what to look out for this month

As March arrives, the evenings start to feel noticeably lighter. The **spring equinox** — the moment the Sun crosses the equator — is on **Friday 20 March 2026**, at midday in the UK. It's a handy marker that we're heading into longer days and (hopefully!) clearer evenings for a bit of stargazing.

You don't need a telescope to enjoy the sky. Try a simple "five-minute sky break" on a clear night: let your eyes adjust, then look for the **brightest "star"** you can see — it's often a planet — and notice how its position shifts as March turns into April. A free stargazing app can help identify what you're seeing in seconds.

If you're feeling adventurous, March is also a good month to keep an eye on **aurora (the Northern Lights)** forecasts. Around the equinox, auroras can be more likely because of the way Earth's magnetic field interacts with solar wind — and if you live or travel north, a dark sky can make all the difference.

Did you know?

- Your eyes need about **10–20 minutes** away from bright indoor lights to switch into "night mode", which makes faint stars much easier to spot.
- The brightest star you can see on spring evenings is often **Sirius** — sometimes nicknamed the "Dog Star".
- A 'shooting star' isn't a star at all — it's usually a tiny bit of dust or grit burning up high in the atmosphere.
- One to pop in the diary: the UK should get a **near-total partial solar eclipse on 12 August 2026** (timings and coverage vary by location) — and eclipse safety is essential.

If you do look up this month, choose somewhere dark and safe, wrap up warm, and take a flask — the best views often happen when you least expect them.

REFLECTION Spring is in the air. The Met Office may say it starts on March 1st but the actual spring or vernal equinox will be on the 20th, when day and night are roughly equal in length. The exact date can vary each year due to the Earth's tilt and orbit around the Sun.

Spring is in our minds too. Now is a time to prepare for gardening, decluttering and spring cleaning, planning an outing or two, perhaps a visit to the park.

So, let's wake up ... to the longer days, warming weather ... and get going if we are able. There is plenty to do. Already, the natural world has been the birds' dawn chorus yet? In January I saw the snowdrops begin to bloom, and seem to get earlier every year?

In March I will be looking out for bluebells: a good place to see a big carpet of them is on the north-east side of Nene Park where it touches Longthorpe. And the trees in the Ortons should be sprouting leaves. I feel lucky to live in a suburb where there are lots of trees (although not so keen where they make bumps in the tarmac on the cycle and footpaths). Being able to get out and about more this month, after the cold and wet winter, brings us into more contact with others in our communities. The indoor pastimes and tv watching may have less attraction, so interacting with others outdoors should happen at some point. But if you cannot venture out for good reason, perhaps open the window for some fresh air. As we journey through the month, let us try to enjoy the company of friends and relatives, groups we are part of, and be considerate to people who are on their own.



This month is also happening during Lent, which began on 18th February. The word 'Lent' has Old English and Germanic roots, referring to the lengthening of days or springtime. It has been used to signify new life and renewal. Also, some people fast from certain foods or some activity - it's a bit like a de-tox - in order to focus on more important things, such as working on personal growth, self-awareness, and better relationships. For Christians it is a time to focus on our relationship with God as well as with each other, not only on Sundays but also during the week with the help of theme-based study guides. This month, churchgoers in the Ortons, Alwalton & Chesterton can enjoy some shared Lent lunches, as well as the World Day of Prayer service on the 6th, that date being the nearest Friday to International Women's Day (8th). March also contains the feast days of St. David (1st) and St. Patrick (17th), and for many of Mother's Day (14th; aka Mothering Sunday) means buying cards and flowers.

At the end of the month, the children will be on the Easter school holidays and we will see the start of Holy Week on 29th. The date of Easter Sunday changes every year (April 5th this year) because it is on the first Sunday following the first full moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox, which was the starting point for this reflection. I hope you have a good month.

Halloumi & lemony lentil traybake (Gluten Free)

A bright, spring-ready one-tin dinner with lentils, veg and squeaky halloumi

Prep: 15 mins Cook: 30 mins Skill: Easy Serves: 4

Ingredients

- 1 red onion, cut into wedges
- 1 red pepper, sliced
- 1 courgette, chunked
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 x 400g tin green lentils, drained
- 1 x 400g tin chickpeas, drained
- 1 lemon (zest + juice)
- 200g halloumi, sliced
- Handful parsley (optional)



Method

- 1) Heat oven to 200°C/180°C fan/gas 6. Toss onion, pepper and courgette with oil, paprika, salt & pepper on a tray. Roast 15 mins.
- 2) Stir through lentils, chickpeas and half the lemon juice/zest. Nestle halloumi on top and roast 12–15 mins until golden.
- 3) Finish with remaining lemon, a splash of olive oil and parsley. Serve with a green salad or steamed greens.
